## RECEPTION ADMISSIONS September 2015

### For September 2015 intake we received 129 applications

The governors, who are responsible for admissions to this Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School, have agreed with the Local Education Authority to admit 30 pupils to Reception class every September. Children are admitted in the autumn term of the academic year in which they will be 5 years old.

### **Criteria (1) as set out in our policy**

Looked-after children (children in public care) or a child who was previously looked-after but immediately after being looked-after became subject to an adoption, residence or a special guardianship order.

**St Mary & St Pancras received 1 application under this criterion, 1 was selected.**

### **Criteria (3) as set out in our policy**

Children with a statement of Special Educational Need (SEN) that specifies the school as the placement school will be allocated a place through a separate procedure in accordance with the Special Educational Needs Code of Practice.

**St Mary & St Pancras received 2 applications under this criterion, 2 were selected.**

### **Criteria (A2) as set out in our policy**

Children whose parent/carer are regular worshippers at either St Mary's Church Somers Town or St Pancras Old Church in the Parish of Old St Pancras or St Pancras Church Euston Road. (Regular worship is attendance at least fortnightly at services for a period of at least one year prior to the application.) A completed Christian worship form is required from the relevant parish priest.

**St Mary & St Pancras received 6 applications, 4 were selected completing the entire above criterion.**

### Criteria (A3) as set out in our policy

Children whose parents are regular worshippers (as detailed above) at other Christian churches who are members of or affiliated to Churches Together in Britain and Ireland or the Evangelical alliance, and who reside within 0.33 miles of the school (distance will be measured in a straight line from the child's home address to the centre of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system). A completed Christian worship form is required from the relevant parish priest.

(Children who have access to a local denominational school of their own faith will not be considered under this category.)

**St Mary & St Pancras received 14 applications, 3 were selected completing the entire above criterion.**

### Criteria (B2) as set out in our policy

Children with a sibling at the same school who will still be on roll when they join. Sibling refers to brother or sister, half-brother or half-sister, adopted brother or sister, step-brother or step-sister, or the child of the parent/carer's partner where the child for whom the place is sought is living in the same family unit at the same address as the sibling. A sibling relation does not apply when the older child will leave before the younger one starts.

**St Mary & St Pancras received 18 applications under this criterion, 18 was selected.**

### Criteria (B3) as set out in our policy

Of the remaining applicants, distance will be measured in a straight line from the child's home address to the centre of the school, using the Local Authority's computerised measuring system with those living closer to the school receiving higher priority.

**St Mary & St Pancras received 101 applications under this criterion, 2 were selected living closest to the school.**

**We have 99 applicants on our waiting list falling under criteria B3 taken from applications received, this will continually change.**
