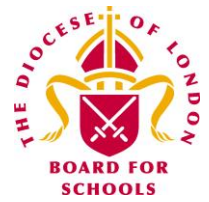

### Mathletics

Dear Parent/Carers,

We have renewed Mathletics for another year as part of the mathematics program at St Mary and St Pancras. Mathletics can help support your child with extra Maths work that will help improve their mathematical understanding as well as their speed and fluency.

To use Mathletics at home they simply sign in with their school username and password using any compatible computer or mobile device. You can sign through your device's browser at [www.mathletics.com](http://www.mathletics.com) and it can be used offline by downloading the Student App. **Their username and password will be sent home this week.**

There are three parts to the Mathletics program:

Firstly, through the 'Learn' tab, your child can complete activities to improve their Maths skills. Through the 'Learn' tab, you will also see 'Quests'. This is where teachers will set work linked to the work they have been completing in class.

Secondly, through the 'Play' tab they can play games that will help improve their fluency with number. A mix of using these two areas of the website is recommended to improve your child's learning.

Finally, there is the 'Explore' tab. This has different videos that can help explain concepts and learn songs and chants to help them learn times tables.
