



Written Statement of Behaviour Principles

A person who can truly be described as educated does not have a vast bank of knowledge; they have the ability to use that knowledge for their own good and for the good of humanity. The development of a strong spiritual and moral framework based on Christian values is an essential part of the education that will be on offer.

The two great commandments given by Jesus will underwrite the life of this school; they are to 'love God' and to 'love your neighbour as yourself'. Both of these instructions should be evident in the whole life of the school, in the relationships between all members of the School community, pupils, staff and parents and also in the management of behaviour.

We believe that high standards of behaviour lie at the heart of a successful school and enable children to make the best possible progress in all aspects of their school life. At St Mary & St Pancras, we value everyone as an individual, capable of growth, change and development. Our relationships are underpinned by the principles of justice, equality, mutual respect, fairness and consistency. We have high expectations that support the development of our pupils as effective and responsible citizens.

Principles:

All children, staff and visitors have the right to feel safe at all times at school.

St Mary & St Pancras CE Primary is an inclusive school.

All members of the school community should be free from discrimination of any sort.

Staff use a wide range of rewards consistently and fairly to encourage and reward good behaviour.

Sanctions for unacceptable behaviour are understood by all staff and pupils and consistently applied – please refer to our Positive Learning Behaviour Policy for further details. Sanctions are applied fairly, consistently, proportionally and reasonably, taking into account SEND, disability and the needs of vulnerable children, and offering support as necessary.

We expect an effective partnership between home and school.
